**TENS OF THOUSANDS PARTICIPATE IN ANNUAL JERUSALEM MARCH:** Tens of thousands of participants from 80 different countries took part Tues. 10 Oct. 2017, in the annual march in Jerusalem marking the 50th anniversary of the city's unification. As participants gathered to start the march, Jerusalem Mayor Nir Barkat welcomed one and all. Israeli tourists, IDF soldiers, representatives of the security and rescue forces, street artists, dancers, musicians and dozens of groups representing public bodies were seen walking side by side. "I came because I love Israel," said Jenny from the United States. "This is my 20th trip here. We are happy to do things for Israel. It's an amazing country." "I'm a Christian but I feel connected to Israel," said Marissa from Catalonia. "I do not know how to explain it, but I feel very close to it. All Christians feel that way." "The Jerusalem march is a tradition which lasted for more than 60 years. Every year it is exciting again, though as this year we celebrate 50 years of unification it is even more exciting than ever," said Mayor Barkat. (Ynet)

**ISRAELI HOSPITAL GETS GRANT TO AID SYRIAN KIDS WITH HEARING LOSS:** An Israeli philanthropist has made a six-figure grant to a hospital in northern Israel to fund treatment for Syrian children who have suffered hearing loss as a result of their country's civil war. Morris Kahn's pilot grant to Ziv Medical Center in Tzfat is part of the Genesis Prize Foundation's global initiative to aid refugee causes and encourage other Jewish foundations and philanthropists to do the same. According to Genesis, Ziv Medical Center has extensive experience treating wounded Syrian civilians. The hospital reports that one out of every three Syrian children from combat areas examined by Ziv's hospital staff suffers from hearing loss. The children are provided testing, treatment, surgery and rehabilitation. "We have treated more than 1,000 Syrians of all ages who needed our help over the past

four years,” Salman Zarka, director of Ziv Hospital. “It’s really important for me as a physician, as an Israeli, and as a human being.” Kahn is a South African-born businessman and philanthropist who moved to Israel in 1956. He is the founder of the Coral World Underwater Observatory in Eilat and of Zalul, a nonprofit focused on cleanup and preservation of the seas and rivers in Israel. (Arutz-7) Israel is still officially at war with Syria. Yet Israel has been quietly treating Syrians injured in Syria’s civil war. Syrian officials secretly transport those in need of immediate care. Israel treats Syria’s injured free of charge. An Israeli official said, “For us they are patients who need immediate help or they will die. It makes no difference whether they’re enemy combatants or civilians.” How can Israel treat the cruelest of their enemies with such great kindness? The Israelis respond, “It’s part of our tradition and our value system based on our Torah (Bible).”

**MEXICAN PRESIDENT THANKS ISRAEL FOR QUICK HELP IN THE WAKE OF EARTHQUAKE:** Mexican President Enrique Peña Nieto thanked PM Benjamin Netanyahu during a telephone call on Tues. 10 Oct. 2017, for the Israeli search and rescue team sent to Mexico City last month following a devastating earthquake there. Nieto expressed appreciation for the way in which Israel quickly mobilized and sent the team to help deal with the after-effects of the 7.1 magnitude earthquake that killed more than 300 people. The earthquake hit on 19 September 2017 and the Israeli team was the first foreign group to give assistance, arriving on the scene just two days later. The team was made up of some 71 soldiers from the army’s Home Front Command. It focused on trying to extricate trapped survivors and on surveying public buildings to determine whether they needed to be demolished after the earthquake or were still structurally sound. When Netanyahu greeted the team upon its return on 28 Sept. 2017, he told the soldiers they were “the long arm of Israel, the long humanitarian arm that reaches around the world, across thousands of kilometers, and you show the true face of the State of Israel.” (J.Post)

**ISRAELI COMPANY CORNEAT VISION UNVEILS ARTIFICIAL CORNEA:** Israel's CorNeat Vision has completed the design and development stage of its artificial cornea implant. Following successful trials in rabbits, the company is initiating formal biocompatibility and safety tests toward first implantation in humans by mid-2018. The implant is a synthetic cornea that utilizes advanced cell technology to integrate artificial optics within resident ocular tissue. CorNeat Vision CEO Almog Aley-Raz said, "Corneal pathology is the second leading cause of blindness worldwide with 20-30 million patients in need of a remedy and around 2 million new cases each year. Though a profound cause of distress and disability, existing solutions, such as corneal transplantation, are carried out only about 200,000 times each year worldwide. There exists an urgent need for an efficient, long-lasting and affordable solution to corneal pathology, injury and blindness, which would alleviate the suffering and disability of millions of people." **GERMAN INTELLIGENCE: IRAN ATTEMPTED TO BUY NUCLEAR TECHNOLOGY ILLEGALLY 32 TIMES:** Iran tried to obtain illicit technology that could be used for military nuclear and ballistic missile programs, raising questions about a possible violation of the 2015 agreement intended to stop Tehran’s drive to become an atomic armed power, according to a German intelligence report from three different German Intelligence sources. The report reveals that Iran made 32 procurement attempts in the German state of North Rhine-Westphalia in 2016 - after the Iran deal was implemented - "that definitely or with high likelihood were undertaken for the benefit of proliferation programs." The report lists Iran as a nation that engages in proliferation, which is defined as “spreading atomic, biological or chemical weapons of mass destruction.” Missile delivery systems are also included in the definition of illicit proliferation activity in the report. Iran was accused of using front

companies in the UAE, Turkey and China to circumvent international restrictions on its nuclear and missile programs. (Fox)

**‘HEZBOLLAH DETERMINED TO GIVE ITSELF OPTION TO ATTACK AMERICA’:** The United States on Tues. 10 Oct. 2017, announced multi-million dollar rewards for two senior members of the Hezbollah terrorist group. Reports said the State Department would offer a reward of \$12 million to anyone with information leading to the discovery, arrest, or charge of the two. The State Department's Counterterrorism Bureau said it would give \$7 million and \$5 million, respectively, for information leading to the capture of Talal Hamiyah and Fuad Shukr. An informational leaflet described Hamiyah as the head of the organization's External Security Organization, its "element responsible for the planning, coordination, and execution of terrorist attacks outside of Lebanon." Shukr was described as a senior operative who played a central role in planning and carrying out the 1983 bombing of a USA Marine Corps barracks in Beirut that killed 241 American service personnel. Nicholas J. Rasmussen, the director of the National Counterterrorism Center, said that the USA believes that Hezbollah is determined to give itself an option to carry out attacks inside the United States. Hezbollah is blacklisted as a terrorist organization in the United States, which regularly sanctions members of the group. (Arutz-7)

**QATARI DIPLOMAT A LEADING CANDIDATE TO HEAD UNESCO:** A diplomat from Qatar is the leading contender to head UNESCO, the UN's cultural agency, it was reported on 10 Oct. 2017. Qatari diplomat Hamad bin Abdulaziz al-Kawari is leading after two rounds of voting to pick the next head of the UN's cultural body, according to the news agency. France's Audrey Azoulay, a former culture minister like al-Kawari, came in second place among the six candidates and is still in the running to replace outgoing UNESCO director-general Irina Bokova. The news was a mixed bag for Israel, which has been nervous about Kawari's candidacy, believing him to be anti-Semitic. UNESCO is notorious for its anti-Israel bias, and it infuriated Israel and the United States by granting full membership to "Palestine" in 2011. In addition, the agency has passed a series of anti-Israel resolutions, including ones declaring the Old City of Hebron to be an "endangered Palestinian heritage site", as well as resolutions which bluntly ignore the Jewish connection to the city of Jerusalem. This week, however, Israel scored a victory at UNESCO, as its board was set to meet and, for the first time since April 2013, not vote on any anti-Israel resolutions. (INN)

**POLL: ARABS PREFER TO LIVE IN ISRAEL:** It's becoming increasingly difficult to describe Israel as an "apartheid state" when a firm majority of Arabs say they actually prefer life in the Jewish state. And the Arab respondents in yet another survey on the matter are saying just that. Conducted by the Konrad Adenauer Program for Jewish-Arab Cooperation Center at Tel-Aviv University, the survey asked local Arab residents how they personally view the State of Israel. A firm 60 percent majority of Arabs overall said they hold a favorable view Israel, while only 37% described their view as unfavorable. Among Arab Muslims, the view was 49%-48% in favor, and among Christian Arabs the view was 61% in favor. Nearly all Druze (94%) said they view the State of Israel favorably. An overwhelming 63% majority said Israel is a good place for Arabs to live. (Israel Today)

**‘THE JEWISH PEOPLE AT ITS BEST’:** Thousands of Jews flooded the alleyways of the Old City of Jerusalem on Sunday 8 Oct. 2017, and headed towards the Western Wall, where the traditional priestly blessing took place in honor of the Succot holiday. After the priestly blessing, Israeli Chief Rabbis Yitzhak Yosef and David Lau, and Western Wall Rabbi Shmuel Rabinowitz shook hands with the thousands of Jews, wishing them a happy holiday and sweet new year. Agriculture Minister Uri

Ariel said, "The Jewish People at its best, tens of thousands of people going up to the Western Wall, looking up to the place of the Holy Temple - 'And let our eyes behold your return to Zion.'" (INN)

**REVOLUTIONARY GUARD THREATENS AMERICAN BASES:** Iran's Revolutionary Guards on Sunday 8 Oct. 2017 warned the United States against designating it as a terrorist group, saying USA regional military bases would be at risk if further sanctions were passed. The warning came after the White House said on 6 Oct. 2017 that President Donald Trump would announce new USA responses to Iran's missile tests, support for "terrorism" and cyber operations as part of his new Iran strategy. "As we've announced in the past, if America's new law for sanctions is passed, this country will have to move their regional bases outside the 2,000 km range of Iran's missiles," the commander of the Revolutionary Guards, Mohammad Ali Jafari said. He further warned that additional sanctions would end the chances for future dialogue with the United States. Jafari also said that Tehran would ramp up its defense capabilities, including its missile program, if the USA undermined a nuclear deal between Iran and Western powers. His comments come amid reports indicating that Trump plans not to recertify Iranian compliance with the 2015 Iranian nuclear deal. The president must inform Congress whether Iran is complying with the deal by 15 Oct. 2017. (Reuters)

**'COUNT DOWN DAYS TO DEATH' IN ISRAEL:** In one of the fieriest speeches directed at Israel by Hezbollah terrorist chief Hassan Nasrallah, he called for the ethnic cleansing of all Jews in Israel, the destruction of the Jewish state and told Israelis to begin a "count down to death." The Investigative Project on Terrorism said the threats contain two messages. "The first message is a reaffirmation of the Shi'ite axis' jihadist, ideological, long-term commitment to Israel's destruction," the report said. "The second message is more immediate; it is an attempt to deter Israeli decision makers from trying to stop Iran and its proxies from taking over Syria." Iran, Hezbollah and several other Shi'ite militias are helping the Syrian regime of Bashar Assad regime complete its victory over ISIS, with the assistance of Russian airpower. The upsurge in war-like rhetoric toward Israel is a signal of growing confidence fueled by their victories in Syria, said the IP T report.

Nasrallah has good reason to remain fearful of Israel, for it is the only state that has both the capability and determination to challenge their takeover of Syria. There have been a series of reported Israeli precision strikes on weapons production centers and arms smuggling attempts in Syria. One strike reportedly targeted the Assad regime's Scientific Studies and Research Center weapons facility, where chemical, biological, and advanced ballistic missiles are developed and manufactured. Israel issued its own warning on what is taking place in the region. "The next conflict, if it erupts, will have a completely different character," said Israeli Defense Minister Avigdor Liberman. "Our enemies will try first to strike our population centers and civilian infrastructure. And if our red lines will be breached, the other side must know in advance that it is going to pay very heavy prices." (WND)

**ABBAS SAYS 'NO' TO TRUMP:** The Fatah Revolutionary Council, headed by Mahmoud Abbas, met at the Palestinian Authority presidential headquarters in Ramallah to discuss the latest developments in the efforts to achieve reconciliation with the Hamas terrorist organization. Fatah leader and PA Chairman Abbas said at the meeting that Jerusalem was "the eternal capital of the state of Palestine." He praised the 'victory' of the Arab residents of Jerusalem against the "tyranny of the occupation" after the thwarting of the installation of metal detectors at the entrance to the Temple Mount. He also called on the UN Human Rights Council to publish its blacklist of companies which do business in Jewish communities in Judea & Samaria, and reiterated that the payments made to terrorists in Israeli prisons would continue. Abbas called the payments to terrorists a national, moral, political

and human duty. The terrorists paid by the PA include many murderers and attempted murderers. The harsher their sentence, the greater the salary they receive, effectively creating a situation where the more Jews a terrorist murders, the more money he receives from the PA government. Abbas also rejected the demand to recognize Israel as a Jewish State. USA President Trump has called on Abbas to work to end terrorism, including by cutting off funding for terrorists and by ending incitement to violence against Jews. Abbas has refused. (INN)

**BAVARIA'S GREEN PARTY: BDS SAME AS NAZI 'DON'T BUY FROM JEWS' SLOGAN: "**  
The Green Party in the southern German state of Bavaria on 7 Oct. 2017 passed a resolution rejecting the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions campaign because of anti-Semitism, at the same time urging its party affiliates to pull the plug on BDS activities targeting the Jewish state. The resolution noted that "BDS positions and demands delegitimize and demonize Israel and thereby assign all blame for every evil in the region to Jews." The document continued, "Israel is the only democratic state and at the same time double standards are applied to Israel when, for example, the criminality of Hamas is ignored or played down." The Bavarian Greens said the "call for a boycott reproduces the National Socialist slogan 'Don't buy from Jews!'" The party urged all affiliates of the Greens, including the federal party, which is expected to be in Chancellor Angela Merkel's new coalition government, to not cooperate with BDS. The youth organization of the Green Party in Bavaria initiated the anti-BDS resolution. Eva Lettenbauer, a spokeswoman for the Green Youth organization, said the anti-Semitic BDS campaign "does not recognize Israel's right to exist" and attempts to damage Israel via boycotts. (J.Post)

**MAN BANNED FROM FACEBOOK FOR CONDEMNING ANTI-SEMITIC INCITEMENT:**  
Facebook banned a man who fought incitement on Arabic-language Facebook pages and was blocked for "incitement" himself. The man, A., responded to those praising the terrorist who killed three and wounded one in the recent terror attack in Har Adar, and suddenly found himself blocked. The Arabs' curses on the Har Adar victims, however, are still online. "After the terror attack, I visited a Facebook page called the 'Jerusalem Media Center.' It's run by Arabs," A. told reporters. "When I started reading, I saw a detestable sight. The terrorist murderer was called a 'shahid,' a martyr. That's an expression of honor. I read through the comments of various visitors. They were all exalting and praising the terrorist. 'Allah will have mercy on the heroic martyr,' and 'Allah will give the martyr a place in Paradise,' were some of the responses. Commenters also cursed the murdered victims. I told the commenters that I don't curse all Arabs just because I disagree with them, and I don't think all Arabs are bad. They wrote that the terrorist is going to Paradise, so I wrote that I think he's going to hell, and 'going with him are all those who encourage him.'" A short while later, when A. attempted to log in to his Facebook account, he discovered that Facebook had blocked him for violating Facebook's rules. "They decided that I was inciting," A. explained. "That's hypocritical. Facebook is full Arab incitement, incitement flourishes there. Those pages publish incitement against Jews who visit the Temple Mount. They also incited against Jews who visited the Western Wall for selichot prayers, writing that it was a 'shame they weren't blown up, it's a shame they weren't burned,' etc. This happens every day, and Facebook does nothing but silence those who try to balance it out." While A. has contacted Facebook, the company has yet to respond. (Arutz-7)

**ISRAEL RECEIVES FIRST RAINS DURING SUCCOT HOLIDAY:** Israel's north, center, and northern Negev received rain on Mon. 9 Oct. 2017, temperatures for the week are expected to remain below seasonal average. Israel's first rains fell during the week-long holiday of Succoth, providing hope for the Kinneret's (Sea of Galilee) recovery. In Sept, 2017 Water Authority spokesman Uri Shore

said that the Kinneret hit a record low the previous month, and "if God forbid the coming winter is similar to the previous four, then our water sources are going to be in huge trouble." Monday morning saw rain showers in Israel's north and center. There were also isolated thunderstorms. (INN)

**120,000 ISRAELIS VISITED NATIONAL PARKS DURING THE FIRST DAY OF SUCCOT:** Around three thousand Israelis spent the night camping on beaches or in overnight parking lots before joining more than a hundred thousand fellow backpackers and hikers who used the beginning of the Succot holiday on Thurs. 5 Oct. 2017 to explore Caesarea Maritima, originally built by King Herod, and Ashkelon National Park. Both parks registered more than three thousand visitors each. Mamshit National Park also gained a lot of visitors thanks to a lively Nabataean market that will keep operating in the next few days. The market, while not a historically accurate portrayal of the ancient desert civilization, is a colorful event in which adults and children can watch traditional craftsmen, listen to music, and try new foods. The public is encouraged to visit the various parks and learn more about the wildlife and nature of Israel. (J.Post)

**ON THE EVE OF SUCCOT, ISRAEL'S SEA OF GALILEE APPROACHES LOWEST-EVER RECORDED WATER LEVEL:** As thousands of Israelis prepare to enjoy the Succoth holiday at the Sea of Galilee, Israel's Water Authority has warned that the country's largest freshwater lake is critically low and in danger of reaching its "lowest water level ever recorded." The Sea of Galilee is currently 703 feet below sea level, just a few feet above the historical low of 705 below sea level measured in 2001 - beneath the water source's so-called "black line." When water levels in the Kinneret cross below the black line, severe ecological complications can irreversibly contaminate the water and disrupt the lake's fragile ecosystem. The situation in the Kinneret has deteriorated in recent years, as Israel's north faces an ongoing drought. Israel has substantially invested in water conservation, reclamation and desalination technology, allowing the Jewish state to significantly reduce its use of water from the Sea of Galilee. Nevertheless, the lack of water flow into the lake has led to deep concern over its vitality, as the drop in water levels causes the salinity of the lake to rise, threatening marine life. The Sea of Galilee has played a prominent role in both Jewish and Christian history, with much of Yeshua's early ministry centered around the shores of the lake, according to the Christian Gospels. **TRUMP TO DECLARE THAT IRAN NUCLEAR DEAL IS NOT IN THE NATIONAL INTEREST:** President Trump is expected to announce this week that he will "decertify" the international nuclear deal with Iran, saying it is not in the national interest of the USA, according to sources briefed on the White House strategy. But Trump would hold off on recommending that Congress reimpose sanctions. Trump faces a 15 Oct. 2017 deadline to report to Congress on whether Iran is complying with the agreement and whether he judges the deal to be in the USA national security interest. On Thurs. 5 Oct.2017 Trump said at a White House dinner, "The Iranian regime supports terrorism and exports violence, bloodshed and chaos across the Middle East. That is why we must put an end to Iran's continued aggression and nuclear ambitions. They have not lived up to the spirit of their agreement." (Washington Post)

**ABBAS ADMITS PALESTINIAN STATE WON'T HAPPEN ANY TIME SOON:** Palestinian leader Mahmoud Abbas admitted last week that an independent Palestinian state wouldn't be established any time soon. He then predictably blamed Israel for that situation, just after he had all but acknowledged that the Palestinians and their chaotic, violent society were holding up the process. Hours before his own Palestinian Authority government was to convene with the Hamas rulers of Gaza

in an effort at Palestinian unity, Abbas told Egypt's CBC News that failure to reconcile for so many years had precluded the establishment of a Palestinian state. "Without Palestinian unity, there is no Palestinian state," said Abbas. Israel has repeatedly noted that it can't make peace with only one half of the Palestinian population. Abbas went on to hint that while his government and Hamas appeared to making strides toward reconciliation, some fairly insurmountable obstacles remained in the way. Chief among those is Hamas' refusal to dismantle its sizable military force. Even if the two Palestinian factions reconciled, a separate Hamas army would be seen by Israel as unacceptable under any final status agreement. For its part, Hamas has repeatedly rejected all calls for it to turn over its weapons. Indeed, the Islamist group's primary claim to fame is its history of armed violence against Israel. **HAMAS NAMES 2014 KIDNAPPING MASTERMIND AS NEW DEPUTY POLITICAL CHIEF:** Hamas has named as its new deputy political chief Saleh el-Arouri, a man best known for attacks against Israeli targets, including the 2014 abduction and murders of Israeli teenagers Gil-Ad Shaer, Eyal Yifrach and Naftali Frankel. El-Arouri is held responsible by Israel for a long list of terrorist attacks in Judea & Samaria. The move is seen as toughening the Islamist movement's posture in advance of reconciliation talks with Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas' Fatah movement. A leading Gaza analyst, Naji Shurrab, noted that Arouri's being tapped to become deputy to politburo chief Ismail Haniyeh comes at the height of Hamas reconciliation contacts with Fatah. In his opinion the move is meant to strengthen Hamas' position in unity negotiations and to signal that the movement will not accept Abbas' political program, including recognition of Israel and acceptance of agreements signed with it. "Abbas wants Hamas to support his political program, including recognition of Israel, respect for agreements, peaceful resistance and being against violence. But the message here is we can't make more concessions on the political program." Hamas and Fatah negotiators are due to meet under Egyptian auspices in Cairo this month in a bid to advance efforts to end a decade-long division stemming from Hamas's seizure of the Gaza Strip from Fatah forces. **PM NETANYAHU: PALESTINIAN DEAL WITHOUT HAMAS RECOGNITION OF ISRAEL 'BOGUS':** Prime Minister Netanyahu stressed last week that Israel would not deal with a Palestinian government that included Hamas if it maintained its anti-Israel stance and remained committed to terrorism. Netanyahu said: "We expect everyone who talks about a peace process to recognize the State of Israel and, of course, to recognize a Jewish state. We are not prepared to accept bogus reconciliations in which the Palestinian factions apparently reconcile at the expense of our existence. Whoever wants to make such a reconciliation must know our clear terms: recognizing the State of Israel, disbanding Hamas' military arm, severing ties with Iran, which calls for our destruction, and so on and so forth. These very clear things must be clearly stated by the Palestinians." (Israel Hayom)

**OHIO LAWMAKER CALLS ANTI-SEMITISM A 'GROWING THREAT ON COLLEGE CAMPUSES':** Lawmakers in Ohio are working to pass legislation expressing support of Israel and denouncing attacks against its supporters, especially on university campuses. Speaking days ago at the Ohio Statehouse, Rep. Andrew Thompson (R-Marietta) raised awareness of House Concurrent Resolution 10 (HCR10), which is also sponsored by Rep. Dave Greenspan (R-Westlake) and co-sponsored by over two dozen other lawmakers. The resolutions condemns the boycott, divestment and sanctions (BDS) campaign - which seeks to isolate Israel until it complies with Palestinian demands - as well as efforts to silence Israeli academics and students. It further calls on Ohio universities to "take an active stand against all anti-Semitic actions and intimidation taken against Jewish students on their

campuses,” and to act against any attempts to restrict free speech on campus. A recent report by the Israel on Campus Coalition advocacy group found that BDS activists routinely engage in “hostile disruptions of pro-Israel events” in order to silence dissenting voices. “Anti-Semitism is not just in existence, but it’s a growing threat on college campuses across the state of Ohio,” Thompson said. “We shouldn’t kid ourselves,” the lawmaker added. “The BDS movement is about wiping Israel off the map. And if we don’t stand strongly and firmly against that, if we do not insist that our campuses protect the rights of Jewish students and allies of Israel, we could potentially face much darker outcomes.” (Algemeiner)

**PROMINENT BRITISH CABINET MEMBER: THERE IS NO DIFFERENCE BETWEEN ANTI-ZIONISM AND ANTI-SEMITISM:** There is no difference between anti-Zionism and anti-Semitism, a prominent British Conservative politician declared last week. Speaking at a Conservative Friends of Israel event in Manchester, Michael Gove - currently the secretary of state for environment, food and rural affairs - said, “At a time when people say that ‘I’m not an anti-Semite, I’m just anti-Zionist,’ it is important that we should say no, anti-Zionism is anti-Semitism.” Referring to the 100th anniversary of the issuance of the Balfour Declaration - in which the British government announced its support for “the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people” - Gove exclaimed, “At a time when people are casual, cruel and callous towards the fate of the Jewish people, it is time for all of us to say that over the last 100 years if we have learned anything it is that when there is prejudice and hatred directed towards the Jewish people darker times will follow, and it is our moral duty to say that what begins with the Jews never ends with the Jews. We stand with Israel. We stand with the Jewish community.” (Algemeiner)
