ISRAELI FLAG COOKIE MOSAIC BREAKS GUINNESS WORLD RECORD: The Jewish community of Atlanta, Georgia, has broken the Guinness World Record for the largest cookie mosaic, by building an enormous Israeli flag. Congregation Beth Jacob - in the presence of Michael Empric, a judge from Guinness World Records - used about 117,000 blue-and-white cookies on Sunday, 3 June 2018 to assemble an Israeli flag that was more than 3,200 square feet in size. The Cookies for the Israel project were trucked in from the kosher Strauss Bakery in Brooklyn, and 300 members of the community gathered at the synagogue to help create the flag. It took just over four hours to complete the enormous project. Organizers for the event confirmed that all the cookies will go to charities and nonprofits in the area to feed hungry people. (J.Post)

DAMAGE FROM KITE TERRORISM: 5 MILLION SHEKELS: Israel's Finance Minister Moshe Kahlon this week addressed the phenomenon of agricultural and kite terrorism which has caused severe damage along the Gaza periphery. Kahlon said that the destruction from the fires set by kites attached to firebombs had reached five million shekels (\$1.4 million). "About a month ago, when the fire kites started, I arrived in the Gaza area and declared that the State of Israel recognizes the phenomenon as terrorism and that the residents will be compensated until the last shekel. To date, 25 claims have been opened, including some 5,000 dunams (1235 acres) of wheat, orchards and irrigation systems. All claims are in advanced stages of processing," he said. He added that security forces in the relevant areas would be intensified and that punishment and increased fines would be imposed on the criminals." PM Netanyahu is presently weighing a plan to allocate compensation taken from Palestinian Authority funds for Israeli communities suffering damage from the kites. (INN)

RUSSIA ATTEMPTS TO CONSTRAIN IRAN: Russia has made it clear that it expects all foreign forces to withdraw from Syria, including those belonging to Iran, Turkey, the USA and the Lebanon-based Hezbollah terrorist organization. A Moscow think tank recently published a commentary blaming Iran for the deteriorating situation between Iran and Israel in the Syrian theater. Putin reportedly has growing reservations about Iran's policy of exporting the Islamic revolution from the soil of Syria. Now, with ISIS fundamentally vanquished, Iranian military activity in Syria has lost its primary justification. Russia is not cutting its ties with Iran, but it is clearly cutting back Iran's freedom of action in Syria. The idea that Russia would back Iran's use of Syria as a platform for operations against Israel or Jordan is not tenable, according to sources close to Putin. The regime in Tehran got the message and issued a sharp rebuke of its Russian ally. The

Iranians did not see their deployment in Syria as temporary. Five years ago, a leading religious figure associated with the Revolutionary Guards declared that Syria was the 35th province of Iran. Besides such ideological statements, on a practical level, Syria hosts the logistical network for Iranian resupply of its most critical Middle Eastern proxy force, Hezbollah. Iranian officials say the country has invested too much blood and treasure - upwards of \$30 billion – to fold to international demands. (Jerusalem Center for Public Affairs)

NETANYAHU PRESSES HARDLINE POSITION ON IRAN IN EUROPEAN TOUR: Israeli PM Binyamin Netanyahu departed Monday 4 June 2018 for Europe, where he is now pushing hardline positions on Iran in talks with German Chancellor Angela Merkel in Berlin; French President Emmanuel Macron in Paris; and British PM Theresa May in London. The Israeli premier's four-day, whirlwind diplomatic tour comes amid efforts by European powers, in conjunction with Russia and China, to salvage the 2015 nuclear deal in the wake of Washington's withdrawal from the accord. Germany, France, and Britain are all parties to the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action—as the nuclear agreement is formally known. While PM Netanyahu's meetings are focusing primarily on Tehran's atomic program, he is also seeking backing for Israel's intermittent use of military force in Syria to prevent the Iranians from gaining a permanent military foothold in the country. Merkel said after a press conference with Netanyahu that Germany will exert its influence in such a way that "Iran is pushed out of this region".

Regarding the Iranian nuclear deal, Merkel acknowledged that the information Israel provided to Germany and the IAEA from the nuclear archives it spirited out of Iran was important but said Israel and Germany have a difference of opinion regarding the agreement. "Germany did not cancel this agreement, and together with other European partners, we stand by it," she said. Asked how Germany can negotiate with a country whose leader Ali Khamenei tweeted on Sunday 3 June 2018 that Israel is a "malignant cancerous tumor" that needs to be "removed and eradicated," Merkel said that Germany strongly condemns this type of language but believes the JCPOA is the best way to keep Tehran from getting the bomb. Netanyahu referred to Khamenei's tweet, and said that it is "amazing that at the beginning of the 21st century, somebody talks about destroying Israel – that means destroying another six million-plus Jews. It is really quite extraordinary that this goes on, but this is what we face."(Medialine/J.Post)

IF IRAN ATTACKS, NATO WON'T SUPPORT ISRAEL: North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg recently announced that NATO will not support Israel in the event that Iran decides to attack the Jewish State. Speaking to media sources, Stoltenberg said "the security guarantee of NATO does not apply to Israel" because Israel is not part of the alliance. He also said that NATO has no interest in involving itself in conflicts in the Middle East. Israel formed a partnership with NATO in 1994, but is not a full member. Stoltenberg also said he did not believe that the 2015 "Iran deal" would last after the USA pulled out, and expressed concern over Iran's activities in the Middle East. According to him, Iran's funding of terror contributes to the "instability" in the region. (J.Post) *How is it that NATO has helped to ensure that Afghanistan is no longer a safe haven for international terrorist groups, when Afghanistan is in the Middle East and has never been a NATO member? NATO has played a significant role in fighting terrorism. NATO became a full member of the Global Coalition to Defeat ISIS. How is it that when it comes to Israel, NATO says its support in the wake of an Iranian attack on the Jewish state would not apply because Israel is not "a part of the NATO alliance" or that "NATO has no interest in involving itself in Middle East conflicts"?*

ARGENTINIAN JEWISH PROSECUTOR NISMAN WAS MURDERED, COURT CONFIRMS: Argentinean prosecutor Alberto Nisman was murdered and did not commit suicide, the Federal Court of Buenos Aires ruled last week on an appeal against a lower court ruling. Nisman was found dead with a single bullet to the head on 18 January 2015, just days after he filed a 300-page document accusing then-president Cristina Fernandez Kirchner of covering up Iran's role in the 1994 bombing of the AMIA Jewish community center in Buenos Aires. The ruling upheld a decision made in December last year by Federal Judge Julian Ercolini. The motive for Nisman's murder was directly linked to the allegations that Kirchner tried to cover-

up Tehran's involvement in the AMIA bombing that left 85 people dead, the judges ruled. In its ruling, the court told the lower-court judges to focus on the criminal investigation "with the speed and seriousness that such a grave fact imposes." In the December ruling, Ercolini said there was sufficient proof to conclude the shot to the head that killed Nisman in January 2015 was not self-inflicted, saying, "Nisman's death could not have been a suicide." In March 2018 it was confirmed that Kirchner, now a senator, would be put on trial for the alleged cover-up along with 11 other former government officials. (J.Post)

FIRST SAUDI WOMEN GET DRIVER'S LICENSES: Saudi Arabia on Monday 4 June 2018 began issuing its first driver's licenses to women in decades. The move comes as Saudi Arabia, the only country in the world where women are not allowed drive, prepares to lift its decades-long ban on female drivers on 24 June 2018. Authorities have started swapping international licenses for Saudi ones in multiple locations across the kingdom, with women applicants made to undergo a "practical test." The move is part of Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman's liberalization drive as he seeks to modernize the conservative petro-state. The self-styled reformer, who recently undertook a global tour aimed at reshaping his kingdom's austere image, has sought to break with long-held restrictions on women and the mixing of the genders. ISRAEL RUSHES EMERGENCY AID TO GUATEMALA AFTER VOLCANO: Israel is rushing emergency aid funding to Guatemala to assist in the purchase of medicine, food, and blankets for those affected by the eruption of the country's Fuego volcano, which has killed at least 62 people and left thousands homeless. (i24News)

HAMAS, ISLAMIC JIHAD CLAIM RESPONSIBILITY FOR GAZA ROCKETS: Gaza's Islamist rulers Hamas and an allied terrorist group claimed joint responsibility on Tues. 29 May 2018, for dozens of mortar rounds and rockets fired at Israel throughout the day. The military wings of Hamas and Islamic Jihad announced in a rare joint statement their "joint responsibility for the striking of military positions and Zionist settlements surrounding the Gaza Strip." At least three IDF soldiers were wounded by shrapnel from rocket strikes on Tuesday. Earlier that day, a mortar fired from Gaza struck near a kindergarten on the Gaza border. Israel's Transportation Minister Yisrael Katz said in an interview with Army Radio that because of the ongoing rocket fire from Gaza "we are closer to the brink of war than we have been since Operation Protective Edge - we are not interested in this and the other side is not, but we have a red line." He stressed: "Toward evening, the situation will worsen." The IDF responded to the continuing rocket attacks with a series of airstrikes against terrorist targets in Gaza. (INN)

WHITE HOUSE CONDEMNS 'DESTRUCTIVE VIOLENCE' OF GAZA VOLLEYS: The Trump administration on 29 May 2018 condemned the Gazan attack on Israel that began in the early hours and continued through the evening. One official called the attacks "reprehensible." Another representative said that they justified "preventative" measures taken by the Israeli military – actions previewed earlier by PM Netanyahu, who has vowed a response to the worst day of projectile fire on the South since the 2014 Gaza war (Operation Protective Edge). "We are aware of numerous mortar attacks on Israel today and are closely monitoring the situation," said a National Security Council spokesman. "We call on those launching the attacks to cease this destructive violence. "We fully support Israel's right to self-defense," the official added, "and to take action to prevent such provocations." Earlier in the day, Jason Greenblatt, USA President Donald Trump's special envoy to the Middle East peace effort, lambasted those responsible for striking at an Israeli kindergarten and implicated Hamas, the terrorist organization in charge of the coastal strip. That strike did not result in any injuries, but others did. "Hamas has failed – all it can offer is terror," Greenblatt wrote on Twitter, calling the attacks reprehensible. "Palestinians in Gaza need real leaders to work on Gaza's real problems with its water, its economy and so much more." (J.Post)

GAZA ELECTRICITY CUT OFF AFTER ROCET STRIKES SUPPLYING FACILITY: One of dozens of rockets launched Tues. 29 May 2018, by terrorists from the Gaza Strip hit facilities supplying electricity to the Gaza Strip. Due to the damage to the facilities, three lines supplying electricity to the southern Gaza Strip were stopped. The electricity company said it would take several days to repair the equipment for a regular supply of electricity. Israel's Energy Minister Yuval Steinitz instructed the Israel Electricity Company (IEC) not to endanger its employees and to repair the problem only after a lull. (Arutz-7)

BELGIAN JEWS LIVE IN 'PERMANENT STATE OF SIEGE,' SAYS HEAD OF ANTI-SEMITISM WATCHDOG: Fear of anti-Semitic violence and the presence of armed police and soldiers outside Jewish institutions has left Belgian Jews living in a "permanent state of siege," the head of Belgium's main Anti-Semitism watchdog disclosed during a wide-ranging TV interview this week. "The presence of military on the street in front of Jewish sites is somewhat reassuring," said Joël Rubinfeld, president of the Belgian League Against Anti-Semitism. "But you can imagine what kind of world we live in." Islamists based in Belgium have carried out several attacks on Jewish targets in Europe during the last decade, among them a gun attack on the Brussels Jewish Museum in May 2014 in which four people were killed. Belgium's 42,000 Jews are also subjected to anti-Semitic harassment by Muslim extremists. Rubinfeld said that over "the last two or three years," his organization had dealt with a dozen cases of Jewish school students subjected to anti-Semitic bullying, as well as a broader trend of Jewish parents unwilling to risk sending their children to public schools. The last fortnight, he added, had witnessed a "rush of anti-Semitic acts" inspired by Palestinian violence on the border between the Hamas-ruled Gaza Strip and Israel. Rubinfeld reflected that it had been difficult to convince Belgian politicians that the country has a serious problem with anti-Semitism. Already in 2008-2009, I told them: 'If you do not do it for my children, do it for your children,' he said. (Algemeiner)

SYRIAN AIR FORCE BARS IRAN FROM USING ITS BASE: The commander of the Syrian Air Force has decided Syria will no longer allow Iranian-backed Shi'ite factions to use its bases to store ammunition and host fighters, the Syrian news forces reported this week. The statement claims that the decision was made "following recent Israeli attacks." Citing a source in the Syrian army, the report stated that this is the first step in a process leading to a Syrian demand that Iranian backed-forces leave Syria. The report goes on to claim that the Syrian regime is experiencing panic since Israel attacked Syrian Air Force sites used by Iranian-backed forces. The London based newspaper Asharq Al-Awsat reported on 26 May 2018 that Israel delivered to Russia a list of "Red Lines" it would not tolerate and warned that it would act to prevent Iran from building up its forces in the whole of Syria, not only in the southern part near Israel. Among these "Red Lines" were the delivery of rockets to Iranian-backed militias, including terrorist group Hezbollah, and the prevention of rocket-producing factories or permanent army bases anywhere in Syria. CAUTION OVER RUSSIAN CALL FOR FOREIGN FORCES TO LEAVE SYRIA: The Russian call for all foreign forces to leave Syria is a positive development with respect to the threat posed by Iranian entrenchment there. That being said, it is important to remember that the Iranians were not party to that announcement and Assad did not ask them to leave. The agreement reported on 29 May 2018 is relevant only to the Syrian regime's efforts to regain southern Syria. The campaign will be waged without Iran or Hezbollah, who will be distanced for 15 miles from the border. The Russian call for a Syrian presence in southern Syria is being read as offering an alternative to Iran being there. Based on media reports, it appears that the Russian president wants to head-off what could easily become a major clash building between Israel and Iran. The core of the Iranian threat are advanced, accurate, long-range ballistic missiles positioned beyond the Golan Heights, and that issue has not yet been resolved. There are three red lines for Iran in Syria: qualitative (ballistic missiles with advanced guidance systems); quantitative (Shia militias); and geographic - which the USA and Russia agreed to resolve in an important understanding between them. Enforcement or any sort of agreement to ensure that the Iranians or Hezbollah do not cross the quantitative or qualitative Israeli red lines has yet to be achieved. (Medialine/Twitter)

ISRAEL'S WEIZMANN INSTITUTE 45TH IN WORLD, UNIVERSITY RANKING ORGANIZATION FINDS: The Center for World University Rankings, initiated in Saudi Arabia and headquartered in the United Arab Emirates, has ranked the Weizmann Institute of Science among the top 50 degree-granting institutions in the world. The Hebrew University of Jerusalem and Tel Aviv University were also ranked in the top 100, placing at 61 and 85, respectively. The Technion-Israeli Institute of Technology ranked 147th, while Ben-Gurion University of the Negev ranked 394th. Bar-Ilan University and the University of Haifa rounded out the list of Israeli universities, ranking at 492 and 620, respectively. Among the factors that contributed to the Weizmann Institute's overall ranking were its "Quality of Education Rank" (8) and "Quality of Faculty Rank" (22). In 2018, the rankings featured universities in 61 countries – more than ever before – among the top 1,000 institutions. (J.Post)

CLAY SEALS OF PROPHET ISAIAH TO BE UNVEILED AT JOINT ISRAEL-USA EVENT: Clay seals believed to have been used by the biblical prophet Isaiah and King Hezekiah are set to be unveiled at a June 2018 event, which will be held simultaneously in Jerusalem and Oklahoma via a live stream. While the seals and nearly three dozen other pieces loaned by the Antiquities Authority will be on display in Oklahoma, the archeologist who made the discoveries, Dr. Eilat Mazar, will deliver a keynote address in Jerusalem. (J.Post)

RARE GUEST IN GULF OF EILAT: A Blue Whale at least 20 meters (65 feet) long was spotted this week in the Gulf of Eilat. The Blue Whale is the heaviest animal ever seen on Earth. Israel and the Gulf of Eilat are far from the whale's distribution area in the North Atlantic and the Southern Hemisphere, including Antarctica. The Blue Whale is considered an endangered species. Dr. Assaf Zvuloni, an ecologist in the Southern District of the Israel Nature and National Parks Protection Authority, said: "This is a very exciting observation point. Whales sometimes travel great distances. From time to time, some individuals increase their range of migrations and there can be many reasons, such as food availability, damage to their other habitats, climate change, etc." (Arutz-7)

INCENDIARY KITES FROM GAZA CAUSE 4 FIRES IN ISRAEL ON SATURDAY: Four air tankers and 12 firefighting teams battled a massive blaze that broke out in the Karmia Nature Reserve on Saturday afternoon 2 June 2018 because of an incendiary kite flown from Gaza. According to initial estimates 2,000-3,000 dunams of the reserve and its surrounding area were damaged in the fire. The topographical conditions in the nature reserve, combined with the strong winds blowing in the area, made it very difficult for firefighting forces to gain control of the flames. Thick smoke covered the area, and there were concerns the blaze might spread to nearby Israeli greenhouses. In recent weeks, Palestinians have been flying incendiary kites across the border, which have caused numerous fires on the Israeli side. Not merely farmers and agricultural lands have been targeted, however, as nature reserves and forests have gone up in flames as well. According to Keren Kayemeth LeIsrael (KKL) data, more than 2,100 dunams (2.1 square kilometers) of woodland have been torched near the Gaza border. Damaged wheat fields can no longer be used as birthing grounds for the area's gazelle population, while the reptilian populace of natural sites such as Be'eri Forest and the Besor Stream will take long to recover. UN 'HOPELESSLY BIASED AGAINST ISRAEL' SAYS HALEY: The majority of the 15 states on the UN Security Council were "willing to blame Israel, but unwilling to blame Hamas, for violence in Gaza," the American Ambassador to the UN, Nikki Haley, said on Friday 1 June 2018, after the USA vetoed a Kuwait-sponsored resolution that urged the deployment of an international force to Judea, Samaria and Gaza. "It is now completely clear that the UN is hopelessly biased against Israel," Haley said after the vote. "The United States will not allow such bias, which is why we did not hesitate to cast our veto." Earlier this week – at an emergency session of the Security Council called by the USA to condemn rockets fired by Palestinian terrorists in Gaza against Israel – Haley remarked that the Palestinians did not require protection from an external predator, but from a Hamas leadership that cynically manipulates the civilian population into

violence. Israel's UN Ambassador, Danny Danon, condemned the Kuwaiti draft "as a hypocritical resolution that sought to condemn Israel while failing to even mention the terrorists of Hamas as the root cause of violence and unrest in our region." Danon continued: "We thank the United States for vetoing the resolution and commend all the Council members who in refusing to support it, defended Israel's right to defend our citizens." REPORT: PUTIN GIVES OK TO ISRAELI STRIKES ON SYRIA: According to a report in a leading Arabic website, Moscow has given its consent to Israeli military strikes deep in Syrian territory. Al-Sharq al-Awsat reported Friday 1 June 2018 that Moscow and Jerusalem held talks the previous day concerning Syria and agreed to "limit" the Iranian presence in the south of the country. Israeli counterpart Avigdor Liberman met in Moscow with his Russian counterpart, Sergei Shoigu, while Israeli PM Binyamin Netanyahu and President Vladimir Putin spoke about Syria over the phone. The two sides agreed to "limit" Iran, keep its forces away from the south, and to allow the IDF to target "menacing bases in the deep Syrian territories," according to the influential London-based website. The Kremlin confirmed that the conversation between Putin and Netanyahu focused on "some aspects of the Syrian settlement." A Russian source told Asharq Al-Awsat that Moscow refuses to offer details about the understanding with Jerusalem "to respect the balance in its separate relationships with Israel and Iran" – as the report phrased it. "Russia is somehow embarrassed because talks with the Israelis mainly focus on a plan to remove Iran and its forces from southern Syria," the source added. Liberman told Shoigu that "Israel greatly appreciates Russia's understanding of our security needs especially regarding the situation on our northern border." (Arutz-7)

USA REFRAINS FROM CONDEMNING ISRAELI APPROVAL ON NEW JUDEA & SAMARIA HOMES: The Trump administration refrained from condemning Israel's approval of the construction of nearly two thousand new housing units in Judea & Samaria as the White House reportedly readies to present its much-anticipated plan to revive the moribund peace process. Instead of denouncing Jerusalem, a spokesperson for the USA National Security Council stated that "the Israeli government has made it clear that it is going forward with its intent is to adopt a policy regarding settlement activity that takes the American president's concerns into consideration." While President Donald Trump has assumed a much more lenient approach to the issue than his predecessor Barack Obama's "not one brick" policy, he has nevertheless described Israeli building in Judea & Samaria communities as "unhelpful". According to the Peace Now organization, about half of the latest homes to be advanced will be located outside of the so-called "settlement blocs," where hundreds of thousands of Jewish Israelis live and which many therefore maintain will remain part of Israel in any future peace deal. It remains unclear, however, whether any negotiating process can be jump-started given Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas' repeated assertion that he will not engage in any USA-led initiative. 'THERE IS NO FUTURE FOR ORTHODOX JEWS IN THE UK': Demands by the British government that Orthodox Jewish schools in the United Kingdom conform with educational requirements, including the teaching about same-sex marriage, pose an existential threat to the observant Jewish community in Britain, a senior haredi leader warned. In recent years, Britain's Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services, and Schools (Ofsted) has demanded that Jewish religious schools include instruction on same-sex marriage and "sexual orientation" issues. Ofsted has threatened the closure of schools which are not in compliance of the 2010 "Equality Act", which requires schools to teach "about protected characteristics" including sexual orientation and "gender re-assignment". Anti-religious organizations like "Humanists UK" have joined the campaign against Orthodox Jewish schools, filing protests with Ofsted against institutions for removing references to homosexuality and abortion in state-issued textbooks. The efforts to compel Jewish schools to teach about subjects fundamentally against their core values are tantamount to an "eviction notice" for members of the Orthodox community, warned Rabbi Aaron Klein. The UK's Education Department is reportedly expected to strengthen regulations regarding mandatory education on same-sex relationships and

gender re-assignment. If adopted, the new requirements could mean that “a school that does not teach a syllabus that includes totally alien, atheistic values could be summarily closed,” Rabbi Klein continued. (INN)

POLL: 23% OF BRITISH RESPONDENTS ‘UNWILLING’ TO HAVE A JEW IN THE FAMILY: Nearly a quarter of British respondents to a poll on attitudes to minorities in Western Europe said they would be unwilling to accept Jews as family members. The Pew Research Center’s report contains results from interviews with more than 24,000 randomly selected adults in 15 countries. In the United Kingdom, 23% of 1,841 respondents interviewed said “no” when asked “Would you be willing to accept Jews as members of your family?” It was the second-highest proportion of negative responses, directly after Italy’s 25%. The highest level of acceptance of Jews as family members was in the Netherlands, where 96% of 1,497 respondents said they would have no problem with a Jew joining their family. In Germany, 19% of 2,211 respondents said they would not accept a Jewish relative. In Austria, non-acceptance was at 21%. The mostly Catholic nations of Spain, Portugal, and Ireland also had high non-acceptance levels at 13%, 18%, and 18%, respectively. In Italy, 12% of 1,804 respondents said they would be unwilling to accept even a Jewish neighbor. (INN) *And God’s reply is: “This is what the Lord Almighty says: ‘In those days ten people from all languages and nations will take firm hold of one Jew by the hem of his robe and say, ‘Let us go with you, because we have heard that God is with you.’”*

DANISH LAWMAKERS SET TO DELIBERATE CIRCUMCISION BAN: Lawmakers in Denmark are set to debate a measure to ban circumcision for children under 18 after organizers attracted more than 50,000 signatures on a petition. “I’m really pleased. This is a great day for us,” said Lena Nyhus, the driving force behind Intact Denmark, the group behind the petition. The petition, citing UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, calls for a six-year prison sentence for those carrying out circumcisions on boys under the age of 18 unless there is a medical reason. The Jewish community in Denmark has objected to the petition, saying that it has practiced circumcision without issues in the country for more than 400 years. Earlier this year, the fellow Scandinavian country Iceland considered a ban on circumcision. However, that bill stalled amid opposition from lawmakers and international outcry. (Algemeiner)
