

**WHAT ARE ISRAEL'S BEST MEDICAL ADVANCES?** After the Sheba Medical Center in Ramat Gan was named in the top 10 medical centers in the world, we wanted to reflect on some of the best medical advances produced by the Holy Land in recent years. Argo Medical Technologies' ReWalk robotic exoskeleton has gained huge media attention for allowing paraplegics to walk and run, and it was even used in the London and Tel Aviv marathons. In addition to being featured in the TV show "Glee," the ReWalk Rehabilitation model currently is used by patients in rehabilitation centers across North America and Europe. There is also a model for everyday use, known as the ReWalk Personal, and it is currently available throughout Europe and awaiting FDA clearance in the United States. The PillCam is still to date one of Israel's most well-known and successful medical devices. Created by Given Imaging, the pill which is swallowed contains a small camera, making it an easier and less invasive form of an endoscopy and can detect disorders of the GI tract. Nano Retina's Bio-Retina, a tiny implantable device inserted into the retina in a 30-minute procedure, turns into an artificial retina that melds to the neurons in the eye. Activated by special eyeglasses, the device transforms natural light into an electrical impulse that stimulates neurons to send images to the brain. The prototype is advancing quickly through clinical trials.

Further developments are expected to be made in the fields of listening devices and dry eye treatment. In 2007, Audiodent developed an innovative hearing aid that clips easily inside the mouth, using the teeth and jawbone to transmit sound to the brain – improving sound quality enormously, particularly in loud places. Looking at the future of medicine in Israel, Yaacov Nitzan of WhiteSwell has raised \$30 million in funding for the treatment to remove excess fluid from lungs and other organs. The process uses a catheter and is minimally invasive, to treat acute decompensated heart failure (ADHF). London-based duo Yosi Romano and Ziv Leinwand's new product called Brizi, is set to revolutionize air distribution for children's prams. The built-in extractor pushes out unwanted air and passes only clean air to the baby in the pram, something that is well targeted for young parents and children in busy cities.

**‘A GOOD YEAR FOR THE ISRAELI ECONOMY’:** PM Benjamin Netanyahu on Sunday morning 31 March 2019 received the Bank of Israel 2018 Annual Report from Bank of Israel Governor Prof. Amir Yaron. “I am pleased to present you with the Bank of Israel 2018 Annual Report,” Yaron told Netanyahu, noting, “This was a good year for the Israeli economy, which is in a good situation. The report reviews many aspects of the Israeli economy, monetary policy, social benefits and the balance of payments, as well as short-range fiscal challenges and opportunities to improve long-term growth.” PM Netanyahu said that he was “pleased to hear it. The economy is in a good situation because our policy is good. We reached a unique achievement in which unemployment is at an all-time low and wages are rising rapidly. This combination is unusual and not self-evident, but it is a great achievement.”

**“I LOVE ISRAEL!” – BRAZIL’S FIREBRAND PRESIDENT LANDS IN TEL AVIV:** For his first trip outside the Western hemisphere, new Brazil President Jair Bolsonaro chose to visit Israel, where he was welcomed by PM Netanyahu and a full honor guard on Sunday morning, 31 March 2019. Bolsonaro is often referred to as the “Donald Trump of Latin America.” He and the USA leader have more in common than just right-wing ideology. Both are also friends with Netanyahu and appear committed to his reelection. Israelis go to the polls in less than two weeks, and Netanyahu wants to remind them that much of Israel's foreign policy successes in recent years rest on his personal relationships with leaders like Trump and Bolsonaro. Would Trump have moved the USA Embassy to Jerusalem or officially recognized Israeli sovereignty over the Golan Heights if Netanyahu weren't at the helm? Maybe, but maybe not. It can be argued that the centrist and left-wing candidates vying for the premiership would have been far more apprehensive about making such requests of the Americans. Netanyahu, by contrast, is intimately familiar with the broad support, especially from Christians, that Israel enjoys in both the USA and Brazil, and knows how to leverage that support to score major diplomatic achievements.

During Bolsonaro's brief two-day visit, Netanyahu is hoping the Brazilian leader will announce the transfer of his nation's embassy to Jerusalem. Bolsonaro promised to do so during his election campaign last year, though most officials haven't expected such an announcement to come during this visit. Instead, Brazilian sources suggested that Bolsonaro could announce the establishment of an official “business office” as a first step toward recognizing Jerusalem as the capital of Israel. Whether or not he moves the embassy this week, there can be no doubt that, as with Trump, Bolsonaro falls firmly on Israel's side in its battle against regional and global foes. “I love Israel!” the Brazilian leader said in Hebrew as he addressed those gathered to welcome him in Tel Aviv.

**NEW TOOL FOR DISPERSING RIOTS: ‘THE ROAR’:** The IDF used a new system, the “Sha’aga” (“Roar”) to disperse the violent demonstrations that took place at the Gaza Strip border over the weekend in which tens of thousands of Arabs participated. Journalist Amir Buchbut reported that the “Sha’aga” is a non-lethal riot dispersal system based on radio waves that was developed in Israel. The soldiers who used the system during the violent demonstrations said that it was very effective. On Saturday, 30 March 2019 the so-called “Million Man March” took place in Gaza to mark the first anniversary of the so-called “March of the Return.” Over 40,000 Arabs participated in the demonstrations. Rioters burned tires and threw explosives and stones at IDF soldiers.

**A SEAL OF THE SERVANT OF THE KING UNCOVERED IN CITY OF DAVID:** A Rare and Exciting Discovery: A 2,600-year-old seal with impression bearing the words: “belongs to Nathan-Melech, Servant of the King.” The Israel Antiquities Authority (IAA) reports that the seal was excavated in the City of David along the south-eastern slopes of the Temple Mount and is dated to the First Temple period. The name Nathan-Melech appears only once in the Bible, in II Kings 23:11, where he is described as an official in the court of King Josiah, who participated in a cleansing of the Temple precincts that King Josiah initiated. “And he took away the horses that the kings of Judah had given to the sun, at the entrance of the house of the Lord,

by the chamber of Nathan-Melech the officer, which was in the precincts; and he burned the chariots of the sun with fire.” The title “Servant of the King” (Eved HaMelech) appears often in the Bible and describes a high-ranking official close to Israel’s kings.

Dr. Anat Mendel-Geberovich of the IAA notes that the fact that this official was mentioned by his first name alone indicates that he was known to all, and there was no need to add his family lineage. The seal was discovered inside an important public building that was destroyed at the same time as the destruction of the First Temple built by King Solomon. According to Prof. Yuval Gadot of Tel Aviv University and Dr. Yiftah Shalev of the Israel Antiquities Authority, the building where the seal and other artifacts were found was destroyed in the sixth century BC - likely during the Babylonian destruction of Jerusalem in 586 BC. Large stone debris, burnt wooden beams, and numerous charred pottery shards were discovered in the building, all indications that they had survived an immense fire. The importance of this building can be seen, among other things, from its size, the finely-cut decorative stones from which it was built, and the high quality of the architectural elements found.

**EGYPT ANNOUNCES DISCOVERY OF ANCIENT PORT USED BY TEMPLE BUILDERS:** An ancient port used to transport stones for the construction of temples and obelisks has been discovered in Egypt, according to the country's Ministry of Antiquities. The ministry said the main port used to transport stone along the Nile River from the quarries of Gebel el-Silsila was uncovered during an archaeological expedition excavating the ruins of Kom Ombo near Aswan. The port on the Nile's west bank extends over 100 meters and lies about 200 meters from a large quarry. River silt and greenery were cleared from the area, revealing inscriptions and mechanisms for tying the boats. Gebel el-Silsila is an important source of sandstone in Egypt that has been widely used from the 18th dynasty into the modern era. Stone used to build temples was mostly cut in the area's quarries. The port's discovery is the latest in a series of recent archaeological announcements. Egypt is hoping to increase tourism interest in a destination that suffered following a 2011 uprising.

**MAJORITY OF ISRAELIS CONSIDER TRAFFIC A CRITICAL NATIONAL ISSUE:** Some 56% of Israelis believe traffic congestion is one of the three most critical issues currently facing the country, alongside public health and the price of housing, according to a recent survey by the Israeli-founded GPS navigation company Waze. Some 70% of more than 1,000 Israelis surveyed across the country said they sit in a long traffic jam at least once a week, and approximately half said they sit in traffic for at least 30 minutes most days of the week. Approximately one-quarter of Israelis also considered carpooling to offer a significant solution to reduce traffic. About half of respondents signaled their willingness to try shared transportation options, and 88% stated various incentives would encourage them to commute with others, including financial incentives, dedicated carpooling lanes and parking spaces for shared vehicles. Today, traffic crowding on Israel’s roads is the worst in the OECD, more than three times the Western average.

**TENS OF THOUSANDS OF VIOLENT RIOTERS GATHER ALONG GAZA-ISRAEL BORDER:** Approximately 40,000 rioters and demonstrators gathered Saturday, 30 March 2019 in several locations along the Gaza security fence, the IDF reported. The rioters hurled rocks and set tires on fire. In addition, a number of grenades and explosive devices were hurled at the Gaza-Israel security fence in a number of different incidents. Most of the demonstrators are still gathered near tents set up close to the Gaza border. IDF troops have responded with riot dispersal means and fired in accordance with standard operating procedures.

**OVER 2,000 VIOLENT INCIDENTS ORIGINATED IN GAZA LAST YEAR:** More than 2,000 violent incidents emanated from Gaza in the past year, Israel said last week. Palestinians in Gaza launched 1,233 rockets, hurled 94 explosive devices and 600 firebombs across the security fence, and committed 152 acts of arson against Israeli forces. Rocket fire killed one Israeli and injured 126. Palestinian attacks on the security fence killed one Israeli soldier and wounded 16. Arson kites torched thousands of acres of Israeli farmland,

causing over \$9.5 million in damage. Last week alone, a total of 55 terrorist attacks were recorded across Israel, bringing the total number of attacks in 2019 to 501.

**‘NO CHILD ON THIS PLANET SHOULD HAVE TO WORRY ABOUT ROCKETS’:** Jason Greenblatt, the USA Special Representative for International Negotiations, on Friday 29 March 2019 called for an end to the violence around Gaza, as Gazans were preparing for violent riots along the border with Israel on the occasion of Land Day. Greenblatt retweeted a video prepared by the Israeli Foreign Ministry which documents Israeli mothers who live near the Gaza border and raise their children under rocket fire. “No child on this planet should have to worry about rockets or missile attacks - these brave mothers in Israel, who are sadly all too familiar with sirens, speak about the effects Hamas' attacks have on them, their families, and communities. The violence must end!” wrote the USA envoy. Last week, Hamas took things further when it fired a rocket which hit a home in the Sharon region, located more than 50 miles from Gaza, injuring seven people. Hamas initially claimed that the rocket was fired by mistake, later changing their story to say that "bad weather" caused the launch. However, on Tues. 26 March 2019, Hamas admitted that the launch had indeed been intentional, and was carried out at Iran's behest.

**USA TO PUT ISRAELI SOVEREIGNTY OVER GOLAN HEIGHTS ON THE MAP:** United States government maps are slated to be redrawn to reflect USA President Donald Trump's official recognition of Israeli sovereignty over the Golan Heights. A State Department spokesperson said that the map changes would be “consistent” with Trump's declaration, although he did not indicate how long it would take to make this change. USA Special Representative for Iran, Brian Hook, said the government would release them “as soon as they are ready.” Israel captured the Golan Heights from Syria during the 1967 Six-Day War and annexed it in 1981. Until now, no member of the international community has officially recognized Israeli sovereignty in the area. Since Trump made his decision and then signed a ratified declaration a few days later, 14 out of 15 UN Security Council member states have condemned the move.

**IRAN TELLS ARABS TO RESIST TRUMP'S PRO-ISRAEL MOVES:** Iran on Friday 29 March 2019 called on Palestinian Arabs to be “steadfast in their resistance” against USA President Donald Trump's moves in support of Israel on Jerusalem and the Golan Heights. The statement came on the eve of “Land Day” and as Gazans prepared to hold marches along the border fence with Israel the following day. “The USA president's recognition of Jerusalem as Israel's capital, and the occupied Golan Heights as part of the illegitimate Zionist regime, shows clearly that Palestinian resistance and perseverance is the right path,” Iran's foreign ministry said on its website. Trump last week signed a proclamation recognizing Israeli sovereignty over the Golan Heights which was liberated by Israel from Syria during the 1967 Six Day War. Israel annexed the Golan Heights in 1981, in a move that has never been recognized by the international community. Iranian President Hassan Rouhani last week accused Trump of "colonialism" in the wake of the Golan move, saying, "Nobody could have believed that a man would come in America and against all international laws give away land belonging to one country to an aggressor.”

**THE MORAL CASE FOR RECOGNIZING JEWISH SOVEREIGNTY ON THE GOLAN HEIGHTS:** The name Golan appears for the first time in the Bible in the book of Deuteronomy as allocated to the tribe of Menashe. The Hasmonean King of Judea, Alexander Jannaeus, conquered the Golan in the first century BC, and settled the city of Gamla. The remains of the synagogue in Gamla is thought to date from the late first century BC. In the days of the Mishna and the Talmud (200-500 AD), many Jewish communities existed in the Golan, as evidenced by the writings of the Jewish sages and backed by archaeological findings. From the beginning of Ottoman rule in 1300 AD until the middle of the 19th century, the Golan was mostly a desolate frontier region ruled by Bedouin tribes. At the end of the 19th century, several attempts were made by Jews to resettle in the Golan, including on lands purchased by Baron Rothschild. At the start of the Six-Day War, the Syrians shelled the Hula Valley and the town of Rosh Pina, and Syrian tanks tried to advance toward Kibbutz

Dan. In the last days of the war, the Israeli government decided to conquer the Golan Heights and put an end to the threat of Syrian shelling.

**OF COURSE THE USA SHOULD RECOGNIZE ISRAEL'S SOVEREIGNTY OVER THE GOLAN HEIGHTS:** In 2011, when the Syrian conflict began, Iran deeply entrenched its forces and its proxies in Syria, while Sunni jihadist groups like ISIS spread throughout the country. Israel recognized the obvious reality: if Syria regained control of the Golan, Israel's worst enemies would be in prime position to attack. With its strategic line of volcanic hills, the Golan gives Israel an absolutely essential topographical advantage. Moreover, Mount Hermon provides the Israeli military critical intelligence. Ceding the Golan to Syria now would be suicidal, allowing the likes of ISIS and Iran to target tens of thousands of Israelis. Israel has controlled the Golan for 52 years, and no Israeli government will ever give up the territory. So Trump's decision changes nothing; it just puts a stop to any delusional notions that the USA would pressure Israel to cede the Golan. Now the USA has made a statement that will deter Israel's adversaries from trying to conquer the Golan.

**GOLAN RECOGNITION TELLS PALESTINIANS THAT TIME IS NOT ON THEIR SIDE:** By recognizing Israel's sovereignty on the Golan, the USA is telling the Palestinians that the next step isn't a better offer. It might be USA recognition of Israeli annexation of part of Judea & Samaria. If you think we won't do it, just look at the Golan. This kind of hardball is probably the only way to disrupt the totally irrational mindset of Palestinians that time is on their side - a mindset artificially kept on life support by decades of status-quo diplomacy. **TOURIST RAV-KAV BUS-TRAIN CARDS NOW SOLD AT AIRPORT:** Rav-Kav smart travel cards are now on sale for tourists at Ben Gurion airport. Since the smart card travel reform has been introduced in Israel's major cities in recent months, tourists have found themselves in an awkward situation. Unable to buy cards when boarding buses, they have been either forced to buy more expensive individual tickets for each ride or made hasty last-minute purchases at bus or railway stations without really understanding the system. The tourist Rav-Kav card called Israel Pass will be sold at a special stand at Ben Gurion Airport's Terminal 3. The anonymous pass (Israelis hold cards with their name, ID number, and picture) can be loaded with a specific amount for inter-changeable travel on buses and trains. Alternatively, tourists can buy daily or weekly cards for travel throughout the country. The cards also provide a 20% discount on entrance fees to Israel Nature and Parks Authority sites, which include Masada, Caesarea and much more.

**PENNSYLVANIA STATE REP. HORRIFIES DEMOCRATS WITH OPENING PRAYER HONORING YESHUA:** Republican Pennsylvania State Rep. Stephanie Borowicz outraged Democrats by mentioning Jesus [Yeshua] 13 times in her invocation on the day of Pennsylvania's first female Muslim representative's swearing-in. Borowicz thanked Jesus, [Yeshua], "the King of Kings; the Lord of lords; the great I Am; the One who's coming back again; the One who came, died, and rose again on the third day", for the honor of being His ambassador, asked forgiveness on behalf of America for forgetting Him and for Him to heal the country, praised Him for President Donald Trump's support of Israel and declared that "at the name of Jesus every knee will bow." Democratic Pennsylvania State Rep. Movita Johnson-Harrell, the first female Muslim representative in the state's legislature, decried the prayer as offensive, as did state Democratic leadership.

**VIOLENCE RESUMES IN GAZA STRIP DESPITE EFFORTS TO REACH CEASE-FIRE:** The Israel Defense Forces resumed strikes against Hamas targets in the Gaza Strip Tues. night 26 March 2019 and into the following day as a flurry of rockets was fired into southern Israel, including two toward the city of Ashkelon that were intercepted by Iron Dome. The exchange followed that of the previous night, when the Israel Air Force destroyed numerous high-profile sites in Gaza, including a "secret" Hamas headquarters and the office of the terror group's leader, Ismael Haniyeh. During that offensive which came in response to a

rocket attack this week that wounded at least seven civilians in central Israel, Hamas and other armed groups in the Palestinian enclave launched more than 60 projectiles at the Jewish state. An unnamed senior Hamas official told media sources Iran had ordered the launch of the rocket, which crashed into a house over 60 miles away. The official said the order was given to an Islamic Jihad cell in the coastal enclave, although Hamas' leadership was aware of it.

**PA: UPSURGE OF TENSIONS COULD LEAD TO 'EXPLOSION' IN JUDEA AND SAMARIA:** As all eyes are on the Gaza Strip following this week's firing of a rocket at the Kfar Saba region and the subsequent Israeli military strikes on Hamas targets, the situation in Judea & Samaria is heating up, following a series of incidents in which five Palestinians and two Israelis were killed in the past two weeks. Palestinian Authority officials in Ramallah warned that the mounting tensions in the West Bank [Judea & Samaria] could grow into a "new intifada" against Israel. Several Palestinian factions have called for increased protests in the coming days. Hamas said that the Palestinian "resistance" in the West Bank [Judea and Samaria] will continue to "use all methods to confront Israeli crimes." The Hamas terrorist group in control of the Gaza Strip, according to PA officials, is trying to divert attention from its problems at home by inciting Palestinians in Judea & Samaria to carry out attacks against Israel.

**EU: WE DO NOT RECOGNIZE ISRAEL'S SOVEREIGNTY OVER THE GOLAN HEIGHTS:** 28 EU member states have rejected the United States recognition of Israel's 1981 annexation of the Golan Heights from Syria. USA President Donald Trump signed that declaration in Washington this week, during PM Benjamin Netanyahu's visit to the White House. But the move has been widely rejected by the international community. "The position of the European Union as regards the status of the Golan Heights has not changed. In line with the international law and UN Security Council resolutions 242 and 497, the EU does not recognize Israeli sovereignty over the occupied Golan Heights," the EU member states said in a short statement issued on Wed. 27 March 2019. The previous day, five EU members of the Security Council also issued a statement against the move explaining that it did not recognize Israeli sovereignty over any territory Israel captured during the Six-Day War in 1967. This included; France, Great Britain, Belgium, Germany, and Poland. Acting USA Ambassador to the UN Jonathan Cohen defended the move, explaining that any peace agreement would have to address Israel's security needs in the Golan Heights. "To allow the Golan Heights to be controlled by the likes of the Syrian and Iranian regimes would turn a blind eye to the atrocities of the Assad regime and destabilizing presence of Iran in the region," Cohen said.

**'TAKE IT FROM THIS BENJAMIN, IT'S NOT ABOUT THE BENJAMINS':** Israeli PM Netanyahu spoke via satellite to the AIPAC conference after cutting his Washington visit short in order to get back to Israel to oversee the response to escalating Hamas rocket fire. In the speech, the prime minister did not shy away from Rep. Ilhan Omar's anti-Semitic tweet trying to reignite the horrific libel that Jewish finances control the world. Netanyahu told the 14,000-strong crowd gathered for the American Israel Public Affairs Committee annual conference: "Take it from this Benjamin, it's not about the Benjamins. The people of America support Israel not because they want our money, it's because they share our values." Netanyahu went on to say that "those who seek to undermine American support for Israel must be confronted. They don't stop at criticism of Israel's policies but spew venom that has long been directed at the Jewish people. To all the anti-Semites out there – we stand up, we fight, and we win," the prime minister said to roaring applause. In the 10-minute speech, Netanyahu also praised USA President Donald Trump for his recognition of Israel's sovereignty over the Golan Heights. "Thank you, on behalf of all the people of Israel," Netanyahu said. "The Golan Heights is indispensable for our defense. It's part of our history and we shall never, ever give it up. It is part of Israel," the prime minister confirmed.

**DUTCH ISRAEL BOYCOTT SUPPORTER TRIGGERS ISRAELI WINE SHOPPING CRAZE:** As a supporter of boycotting Israel, Mieke Zagt had no intention of marketing Israeli wine when she posted on Twitter a picture of it on sale at the Hema Dutch supermarket chain. The opening shot for the campaign was a

tweet that Zagt, an Electronic Intifada contributor posted Mon. 25 March 2019. “Hey, Hema, you’re selling Efrat wine from Judean Hills as made in Israel. Is this possible? Efrat and Judean Hills are in occupied Palestinian land. Efrat is an illegal Israeli colony. Can you verify the origin?” Zagt wrote, attaching a picture of the bottles in question. In reality, the Efrat Winery is one of Israel’s oldest and located in Tsor’a, a town that is located within Israel’s 1949 armistice line. Despite its name, the wine is not from a disputed territory. But Zagt’s tweet ended in more than a geography lesson. Gideon van der Sluis, a Dutch-born Israeli business consultant, and several other pro-Israel advocates began engaging on Twitter with like-minded users about Zagt’s tweet. Within 24 hours it became the top-trending item on Dutch Twitter, with people from around the country using it with pictures of freshly bought Efrat wine bottles. Within hours, both the red and white Efrat wines were sold out from the online store of Hema - a huge chain with 525 stores in the Netherlands alone. The wine began selling even faster after Christians for Israel, an international group whose headquarters is just outside Amsterdam, posted an article on their website and Facebook page encouraging their many thousands of readers and supporters to buy Efrat Wines. Hema has declined to say how many bottles were sold, citing their policy. But they acknowledged that many of their branches as well as their online store have run out of Efrat wine. Esther Voet, the editor-in-chief of the NIW Dutch Jewish weekly, said she found the story amusing. “It’s hilarious,” she said. “Everybody started to buy Israeli wine.”

**ANCIENT JEWISH VILLAGE UNEARTHED IN EASTERN JERUSALEM:** Impressive remains of a Jewish village from the Hasmonean period, approximately 2000 years ago, are currently being uncovered in a salvage excavation conducted by the Israel Antiquities Authority in the Shuafat neighborhood of Jerusalem where an elementary school will be built. The excavation has yielded remains of a large wine press containing fragments of many storage jars, a large columbarium cave (rock-cut dovecote), an olive press, a large ritual bath, a water cistern, rock quarries, and installations. The most significant feature of the excavation is an extravagant burial estate, which included a corridor leading to a large courtyard chiseled into the bedrock. The courtyard had an encompassing bench, with the entrance to the burial cave from its façade. The cave included several chambers, each with oblong burial niches chiseled into the walls. In order to respect the buried parties, and in accordance with the orthodox restrictions of disturbing the burials, the cave was sealed. The earth which covered the courtyard of the burial estate contained some large building stones, some of which are elaborate architectural elements common during the 2nd temple period. The current excavation has only exposed a small part of a larger village that existed to its south. However, despite the limited exposure, the finds seem to indicate that the village was of agricultural nature, and among other things produced wine and olive oil, as well as breeding doves. Doves were an important commodity during the time of the Second Temple and in other periods as well, as meat and eggs were consumed by the people and also used for sacrificial offerings at the temple.
